The Union of Towns and Cities of Slovakia (Union/UTCS) is voluntary association of cities founded on April 29, 1994 in Košice at the initiative of the Club of Mayors of the Slovak Republic.

- UTCS membership consist of large and mediumlarge cities:
- 78 cities, 5 municipalities and 5 special members that are municipal parts of Bratislava and Košice.
- Union members represent more than 2,5 millions of Slovak inhabitants.



Main Goals of the Union:

- Promoting role of cities as centers of regions in the process of decentralization and public administration modernization;
- Supporting restoration and protection of the environment and cultural heritage
- Supporting development of cooperation of cities, municipalities and regions at pan-European level
- Encouraging partnerships of public, private and third sectors
- Supporting pan-European cooperation focus on Local Agenda 21 and Intelligent Energy Europe
- Supporting and promoting Covenant of Mayors



In **2004** on the initiative of **Energie-Cities** (the Association of European local authorities promoting local sustainable energy policy) was launched the process of creating national Interest Associations of Cities and Municipalities for sustainable Energy Efficiency

The main impulse - **BISE MEMORANDUM** (BISE - **Better Integration through Specific Exchanges for Sustainable Energy**)

Slovakia is one of the signatories and also belongs to other 22 States that work on the development of BISE initiative in the European context **CITENERGO** – Interest Association of Cities and Municipalities for Sustainable Energy Efficiency



CITENERGO Association was created following initiative of the **Union of Towns and Cities of Slovakia** and **Energy Centre Bratislava** in the framework of pan European BISE Process

Declaration of Association's establishment was signed on **October 12, 2007** in TRENČIN at the Union of Towns and Cities Presidium meeting

CITENERGO includes **9 full members** (Gelnica, Košice, Kremnica, Nitra, Prešov, Vrable, Śala, Hurbanovo, Kolarovo) and **4 associated members** **CITENERGO** – Interest Association of Cities and Municipalities for Sustainable Energy Efficiency



Main Goals of CITENERGO Association: information, administrative and expert support to Slovak Self-administration, especially at:

- Preparation of energy policies
- Ensuring energy efficiency (EE) and the use of local renewable energy resources (LRER)
- Providing information on supporting financial mechanisms
- Mediation of financial and investment counselling in preparation and implementation of specific projects
- Accessing information database in the framework of pan European Energy-Cites Association
- Supporting and promoting of Covenant of Mayor at national and local level between the Slovak municipalities

UTCS and CITENERGO in cooperation with Energy Centre Bratislava and expert partners offers to its members:

- trainings of municipal managers and experts in the area of LRER and EE
- expert support in establishing and managing local energy agencies
- implementation of energy policies and action plans of energy efficiency
- exchange and dissemination of actual know-how from successful projects
- support in preparation and implementation of projects in the framework of grant schemes of the EU Structural funds
- lobbing and expert counseling in the legislative area at the national level

EU 2020 and the Covenant of Mayors

EU2020 objectives will not achieved without the active involvement of municipalities, cities and regions equipped with the necessary capacity and support mechanisms.

The role of cities and regions is highlighted by the **EU energy policy**: Energy Strategy in 2011-2020; EE Action Plan; SET - Plan (Smart Cities)

The **Covenant of Mayors** is the mainstream European movement involving local and regional authorities, voluntarily committing to increasing energy efficiency and use of renewable energy sources on their territories.



After the adoption in 2008 of the **EU Climate and Energy Package** the European Commission launched the Covenant of Mayors to endorse and support the efforts deployed by local authorities in the implementation of sustainable energy policies.

- The **Covenant of Mayors** is the mainstream European movement involving local and regional authorities, voluntarily committing to increasing energy efficiency and use of renewable energy sources on their territories.
- By their commitment, **Covenant signatories** aim to meet and exceed the European Union 20% CO_2 reduction objective by 2020.



The **Covenant of Mayors** has been portrayed by European institutions as an *exceptional model of multi-level governance.*

CITENERGO Association in strong cooperation with the **Union of Towns and Cities of Slovakia, ECB-Bratislava** and other partners regularly informed the Slovak cities and towns about Covenant of Mayors office activities via the UTCS web-site.

The **Covenant of Mayors** was presented during the National Conference "City, Municipality – Effective Energy" in 2008 and 2009, 2010 and during the different training and workshops focus on municipal energy policy and energy efficiency.



Signatories represent cities that vary in size from small villages to major metropolitan areas such as London or Paris.

Within a year following their signature, **Covenant signatories** commit to implement **Sustainable Energy Action Plan** on their territory, with the aim of cutting CO₂ emissions by at least 20% by 2020.

The list of European cities and municipalities that have signed up to the Covenant includes

2867 Signatories.



Situation of networking related to the **Covenant in Slovakia**:

Moldava nad Bodvou municipality and city of Nitra were sign the Covenant of Mayors.

4 next municipalities from Trnava region (<u>Malženice</u>, <u>Chtelnica</u>, <u>Drahovce</u>) and Trenčin region (<u>Pobedím</u>) are planning to sign the Covenant at the end of 2011.



The Union of Towns and Cities of Slovakia became a Covenant Supporter in 2011

and it is committed to carry out the following tasks among its members:

Promote accession to the Covenant of Mayors (CoM) and to provide support and coordination to those members signing up

- Facilitate exchange of experience between signatories and candidates to the CoM
- Play an intermediary role between the members and Covenant of Mayor office and with the national /regional media
- Participate in discussions on the strategic implementation of the CoM initiatives proposed by the Commission



To date, the number of <u>Covenant of Mayors</u> signatories is high and still increasing. It is crucial that these local authorities' commitments be implemented successfully - thanks to the power of networking.

The **NET-COM project** (NETworking the COvenant of Mayors) aims at **empowering local authorities** (at both political and administrative levels) to implement successfully their current or future Covenant engagements.

Thus NET-COM directly supports the targets of the EU Energy and Climate Package. The project is funded under the Intelligent Energy Europe. It is carried out by a consortium of 12 partners from 12 different European countries

- In each country **Covenant Networking Platforms** will be created to ensure:
- better communication and exchanges among local authorities (Covenant Signatories or not) which want to improve their own capacities and effectiveness to achieve the Covenant goals;
- better communication, exchanges and synergies between local authorities and key actors such as public institutions (ministries, national/regional agencies, regions, provinces, associations of local and regional authorities) and any other stakeholders (businesses, NGOs, associations, etc.) willing to support local authorities in their efforts to achieve the Covenant objectives.



The continuous capacity building of the European, national and regional **networks of local authorities** will be crucial for the coming years.

NET-CoM project will set up a permanent cooperation among the networks in order to benchmark their experiences, practices, tools and working methods.

CITENERGO and **the Union of Towns and Cities of Slovakia** will focus their efforts on the strengthening this Net-work and on the implementation successfully their members current or future Covenant engagements.
